



Richard C. Friedman M.D., Editor of *Psychodynamic Psychiatry* is Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Cornell/Weil Medical School in NYC, Lecturer in Psychiatry at Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons, and Faculty Member at the Columbia Center for Psychoanalytic Training and Research. He received his MD from the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry and was a resident in Psychiatry and Chief Resident at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Dentistry and NY State Psychiatric Institute. Friedman was the first investigator to describe the effects of sleep deprivation on the performance of physicians. He went on to do research on depression and then on the endocrinology and psychodynamics of sexual orientation. His book on male homosexuality was the first to integrate neuroscience, sexology, developmental psychology and psychoanalytic theory and practice.

Drs. Friedman and Downey began a collaboration in 1991 which led to many publications and a book on sexual orientation and psychoanalysis (later published as *Sexual Orientation and Psychodynamic Psychotherapy*). They are Co-Chairs of the Human Sexuality Committee of Group for the Advancement of Psychiatry. Friedman received the Mary S. Sigourney Award in 2009 from the Sigourney Trust in recognition of distinguished contributions to the field of psychoanalysis. He practices in NYC.
