### EDITOR'S COLUMN

I begin this column with interesting news. It will be my last column as your Editor. I have the great honor of assuming the role of President-Elect of the Academy after the May meetings, and Sharon West, MD will be replacing me in the Editor's seat.

It has been my great pleasure to be the Editor of the Academy News for the past several years. As an organization, we have undergone changes in "professional management," but not in mission or the wonderful sense of fellowship, both hallmarks of the Academy. This was emphasized for me at the Future Directions Forum in which I participated at the last meeting at Chapel Hill. It was a wonderful session; it accomplished work goals and clarified new directions for the Academy as well as provided a welcome opportunity to brainstorm with interesting Academy colleagues. I heartily encourage one and all to attend the next session at our meeting in NYC. You needn't have participated in the first session to be welcome at this second one.

Dr. West probably needs no introduction. She has been a Trustee of the Academy, serving on Council since 2002, as well as the current Chair of the Study Group on Psychoanalysis and Women. She has presented several papers at our meetings as well. I also knew that she had been in the US Military service, and was a "C-L" psychiatrist. I would like to exercise the Editor's prerogative and share with you some other information about Dr. West, a genuinely modest individual.

A self-declared fifth-generation Mississippian, with many ancestors in the military, Sharon

graduated from Tulane University with a Major in Spanish Literature and a Minor in English. She returned to MS for Medical School, and her first career after graduation was in Emergency Medicine, in which she was Board Certified. From 1990-1993 she was Chief of the Emergency Medical Service at the Reynolds Army Community Hospital in Ft. Sill, Oklahoma. In the Army Reserve from 1983, she went on Active Duty in 1990, attaining the rank of Lieutenant Colonel in the US Medical Corps. Sharon started her second career in medicine in 1993, when she went to Walter Reed Army Medical Center to do her Psychiatry Residency and her Fellowship in C-L Psychiatry. Her next job was at Ft. Campbell, KY as the Commander of the 83<sup>rd</sup> Medical Detachment, Combat Stress Control and a psychiatrist at the Blanchfield Army Community Hospital. She is proud of the lectures she delivered there, which were incorporated into the Army archives on Suicide Prevention, Women's Issues in the Field (a version of which was presented at a meeting of the Academy), POW's, Pre-Deployment for Families, and others. She returned to Mississippi in 2000, practicing Adult C-L Psychiatry near several generations of her family. Dr. West is married to a farmer "with cows, and (his true love) walker hounds." They have a large blended family.

At every turn in Dr. West's career, she has accumulated a list of community service honors. It is, therefore, not a surprise that she was willing to take over the job as Newsletter Editor. I know I am leaving the Newsletter in most capable and "civic-minded" hands.

## PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

It is my pleasure and privilege to be able to write to all of you.

### Membership

Nearly a year ago, I stood before you at the business meeting as President-Elect and stated that my most important goals for the coming year would be recruitment and retention of members. So how have we fared? We all owe a vote of thanks to Academy Secretary César Alfonso, Treasurer Ann Price, Executive Director Jackie Coleman and especially to Jackie's assistant, Shalon Davis, for helping the Academy achieve a record!

In 2003, we acquired 30 new members—an increase of about 20%. Our Secretary César Alfonso projects that in 2004 the number of new members joining will be even higher. The Academy now consists of 560 General Members, 165 Fellows, 25 Foreign Fellows, and 61 Life Fellows.

### Grants

It is the Academy's good fortune to be the recipient of two generous grants from the Alexandra and Martin Symonds Foundation. The Foundation's requirement was that both grants promote women's issues. For 2003, the grant supplemented distribution of the Spring issue of the *Journal*, whose theme is "Women and Society." Grant money financed the printing of 2,000 extra copies to be distributed to all members of the Association of Women Psychiatrists—of which Allie was the Founder and first President. On a personal note, I find this serendipitous. I was fortunate to have been active in women's issues for many years alongside Allie, and I am the guest editor of "Women and Society." The 2004 grant is being used for the Symonds Symposium on "Women, Assertion, and Aggression" at our annual meeting in May.

### Planning

After hearing for a long time that we really need to have a special day set aside for a strategic planning forum, I decided to hold it at the start of our winter meeting in Chapel Hill. The daylong exercise was co-chaired by two extremely skillful leaders: Ian Alger and Joseph Merlino. Working in five small groups, participants shared their memories about the Academy's past, their

thoughts on how it now functions, and their vision for the future.

This meeting was exciting—both in terms of the ideas which came forth (some of which have already been implemented), and the energy and vitality that we all felt. It reminded me of many past Academy meetings when people were brimming with enthusiasm. And so we voted to hold Future Directions Forum II just before the start of our Annual Meeting. All Academy members are welcome.

### PEP Project

I am delighted to report that the Psychoanalytic Electronic Publishing (PEP) Project is at last under way. Our *Journal* will be digitized and published in the next edition of PEP's CD-Rom disks. This involves the scanning and retyping (electronic digitization) of every issue of the *Journal*, starting with the first one from over 30 years ago. Joining PEP puts us in the company of other peer-reviewed psychoanalytic journals. And it means that our authors become more available to scholars who use the PEP system.

After lengthy negotiations among the Academy, the PEP Project people, our attorney, and Guilford Press, the details have been ironed out to everyone's satisfaction and we are moving our *Journal* into the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Doug Ingram, *Journal* editor, and Mariam Cohen, co-editor of the Forum, are to be congratulated on the success of this project. For further information about PEP, please contact Mariam Cohen.

### Conclusion

Intellectual debate in Academy publications, increasing member participation and recruitment, and preserving the Academy endowment are among our most vital goals for the future. President-Elect Joseph Merlino will certainly be a great leader. I have enjoyed the year—I appreciate the help of the Academy's Past Presidents—and I look forward to seeing you in May.

The topic of the meeting is *Schizophrenia: Thirty Years Later; In the Footsteps of Silvano Arieti*. The meeting is additionally sponsored by the Arieti Foundation, the Department of Neuroscience of the University of Pisa, and the Department of Psychology of the University of Milan. The venue of the meeting is the Auditorium dell'Opera Primaziale di Pisa, in the city center, just under the leaning tower.

The Keynote Speaker is Dr. Ann-Louise Silver, a past President of the Academy and current Chair of

the Committee on Programs. There will be other excellent speakers as well, including Robert Cancro, Chair of the Department of Psychiatry at the New York University School of Medicine; Clarice Kestenbaum, a past President of both the Academy and also of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and Stephen Cozza, Chief of the Department of Psychiatry at the Walter Reed Army Hospital. The program is an exciting one and will honor the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Silvano Arieti's birth in Pisa.

Pisa is a beautiful city, rich in history and architecture. June is a wonderful month to explore Tuscany. Space is limited, so Academy members are urged to register as soon as possible for this outstanding international meeting.
