Dr. Plakun is Director of Admissions and Professional Relations at the Austen Riggs Center in Stockbridge, MA. He has been a Clinical Instructor in Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School for over 20 years. He is the editor of *New Perspectives on Narcissism* (American Psychiatric Press, 1990) and *Treatment Resistance and Patient Authority: The Austen Riggs Reader* (Norton Professional Books, 2011) and author of more than forty papers and book chapters on the diagnosis, treatment, and outcome of patients with borderline and other personality disorders, suicidal and self-destructive behavior, and treatment resistant disorders. He is a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, past Chair of its Committee on Psychotherapy by Psychiatrists, and a Psychoanalytic Fellow of the American Academy of Psychoanalysis and Dynamic Psychiatry, where he is a former member of its Executive Council. In 2004 he was appointed Academy representative to the APA Assembly, where he chairs the Assembly Allied Organization Liaisons Committee and serves on the Assembly Executive Committee. He is a Fellow of the American College of Psychiatrists, an Honorary Fellow of the American College of Psychoanalysts, and a member of the editorial board of *Psychodynamic Psychiatry*. He has appeared on the CBS show *60 Minutes*, where he was interviewed by Mike Wallace as an expert in forensic psychiatry.
