Message from the Program Co-Chairs: This is the first in-person Annual Meeting of the American Academy of Psychodynamic Psychiatry and Psychoanalysis since 2019. During the past three years, the coronavirus pandemic has killed millions of people, especially the unvaccinated, the elderly, and those with co-morbid medical conditions, as well as destroyed thousands of livelihoods. The pandemic has interfered with education, especially among the underserved and small children, and science and medicine were countered by superstition and false beliefs. An unconscionable war was begun by Russia that continues to rage in Ukraine (as this introduction is being written). Intense political battle lines were drawn in the U.S. that persist today.

The murder of George Floyd, among other racially motivated events, resulted in a reckoning about racial justice. Psychiatric and psychoanalytic organizations around the country – including our own – began to examine not if, but how, they were guilty of systemic racial bias and contributed to other injustices. There has also been an increased focus on sexual orientation and gender identities. We continue to strive for plurality and representation as the key to understanding all patients we serve. Finally, climate change is having a devastating effect on our planet and threatens the well-being and the future of humans, plants, and other animals. Race, gender, and climate have entered the chat!

These topics have entered our clinics and consultation rooms and affect our patients at a deep level. This annual meeting of the American Academy of Psychodynamic Psychiatry and Psychoanalysis will present panels, papers, and workshops that will examine the intersection between these and other events taking place in the world, and the individual psychodynamic effects they have on our patients. We will also hear contributions that address other theoretical and clinical issues that psychodynamic psychiatrists encounter daily in their clinics and consultation rooms.

Program: The American Academy of Psychodynamic Psychiatry and Psychoanalysis is the APA affiliate society that provides a forum for psychiatrists and collaborates with social workers, teachers, and psychologists. The Academy is a member society of the World Psychiatric Association. Our annual meeting provides an opportunity to interact in a collegial and enriching relaxed environment. There will be many opportunities for discussions since our presentations will leave ample time for audience participation. This meeting will provide a venue to meet and socialize with your Academy friends and colleagues, as well as with outside experts in psychodynamic psychiatry.

Conference Learning Objectives: This meeting has been designed to meet the following professional practice gaps and the needs derived from those gaps:

Gap #1:

Improving treatment of patients by:

- A. Attaining sufficient knowledge of psychodynamic principles and the ability to apply this knowledge.
- B. Enhancing the ability to integrate dynamic principles, psychopharmacology, and neuroscience in clinical practice.

Needs derived from the gaps above:

- A. To learn about development of therapeutic alliances; transference and countertransference; the handling of challenging situations; and practical applications of psychoanalytic theories.
- B. To learn about complex pathologies, neuroscientific advances, pharmacological treatments, and medical conditions and their implications/ramifications for psychodynamic psychotherapy.

Gap #2:

Enhancing training of residents and early career psychiatrists.

Needs derived from this gap:

- A. To learn new ways of engaging residents and training them in the complex theories and techniques of psychodynamic psychotherapy.
- B. To foster learning of complex theories and techniques of psychodynamic psychotherapy by early career psychiatrists.

All presentations must address at least one of the specified needs.

The Academy expects the results of its CME program to be an improvement in competence or performance.

Definitions: "Competence" refers to knowing how to do something; and "Performance" is what a psychiatrist would do in practice if given the opportunity.

Target Audience: Those interested in the recent developments and clinical application of psychodynamic approaches: a) psychoanalysts, psychiatrists, child and adolescent psychiatrists, other physicians, residents and fellows; b) psychologists, interns and students of psychology; c) social workers, students of social work; d) allied professionals and students.
